What is the summer reading challenge?


Since 1948, the Ouachita Parish Public Library has challenged patrons to read as much as they can during the summer. What started as a reading club for children has expanded to a months-long, themed-celebration for all ages. Children, teens and adults receive fun incentives for reading and completing community challenges.

For the Summer Reading Challenge!

Who can join the summer reading challenge?

Anyone with a Ouachita Parish Public Library card can join! There are three age categories for the summer reading challenge, with different page goals, prizes and programs. Children ages 12 and under can join the Kids Category, teens ages 13-19 can join the Teen Category, and adults 18 and up can join the Adult Category. Patrons who are 18 or 19 years old can choose whether they would like to join the Teen or Adult Category.



After logging into the summer reading portal, enter the books you read and the challenges you complete to win prizes!

When is the summer reading challenge?

The summer reading challenge is from **June 1 - July 31, 2021**.

What is this year's theme?



ALL CREATURES GREAT AND SMALL BY JAMES HERRIOT

Originally published in the 1970s, this memoir collection by the English country veterinarian is beloved by millions worldwide. The book has been adapted into a TV series multiple times, most recently aired this year as a *Masterpiece Theatre* on PBS.

In All Creatures Great and Small, we meet the young Herriot as he takes up his calling and discovers that the realities of veterinary practice in rural Yorkshire are very different from the sterile setting of veterinary school. Some visits are heart-wrenchingly difficult, some are lighthearted and fun, and yet others are inspirational and enlightening, such as Herriot's recollections of poor farmers who will scrape their meager earnings together to be able to get proper care for their working animals. From seeing to his patients in the depths of winter on the remotest homesteads to dealing with uncooperative owners and critically ill animals, Herriot discovers the wondrous variety and never-ending challenges of veterinary practice as his humor, compassion, and love of the animal world shine forth. *Available in print, large print, book-on-CD, on the cloudLibrary app as both an e-book and e-audiobook, and on the Hoopla app as an e-book. 
TRAVELLING CAT CHRONICLES BY HIRO ARIKAWA

Told from the point of view of a snarky cat, *The Travelling Cat Chronicles* is a road trip story like no other.

Nana the cat is on a road trip. He is not sure where he's going

or why, but it means that he gets to sit in the front seat of a silver van with his beloved owner, Satoru. Side by side, they cruise around Japan through the changing seasons, visiting Satoru's old friends. He meets Yoshimine, the brusque and unsentimental farmer for whom cats are just ratters; Sugi and Chikako, the warm-hearted couple who run a pet-friendly B&B; and Kosuke, the mournful husband whose cat-loving wife has just left him. There's even a very special dog who forces Nana to reassess his disdain for the canine species. But what is the purpose of this road trip? And why is everyone so interested in Nana? CARRYING ALBERT HOME BY HOMER HICKAM

From the author of *Rocket Boys* – the basis of the movie *October Sky* – comes a whimsical tall tale about a man, a woman and an alligator that is a moving tribute to love.

Elsie and Homer were high school classmates in the West Virginia

coalfields, graduating just as the Great Depression began. Unfulfilled as a miner's wife, Elsie was reminded of her carefree days with a long-lost lover because of his unusual wedding gift: an alligator named Albert she raised in the only bathroom in the house. When Albert scared Homer by grabbing his pants, he gave Elsie an ultimatum: "Me or that alligator!" After giving it some thought, Elsie concluded there was only one thing to do: Carry Albert home. *Carrying Albert Home* is the funny. sweet, and sometimes tragic tale of a young couple and a special alligator on a crazy 1000-mile adventure. SGT. RECKLESS: AMERICA'S WAR HORSE BY ROBIN HUTTON

A little-known story about a legendary hero in the forgotten war, *Sgt. Reckless* is a gripping biography about a decorated Marine who just so happens to have four hooves.

Amid an inferno of explosives on a deadly minefield in the Korean War, a four-legged Marine proved

to be a heroic force of nature. She moved headstrong up and down steep, smoky terrain that no man could travail confidently. In a single day, this small Mongolian mare made 51 round-trips carrying nearly five tons of explosives to various gun sites. Sergeant Reckless was her name, and she was the horse renowned for carrying wounded soldiers on and off the battlefield and making solo trips across combat zones to deliver supplies. Hutton has written the first-ever full biography of Sergeant Reckless, who earned two Purple Hearts for her heroic efforts (among other military decorations). THE FEATHER THIEF BY KIRK WALLACE JOHNSON

For bird nerds, true crime podcast junkies and environmentalists, *The Feather Thief* is a narrative nonfiction book that weaves together natural history and an unbelievable heist into a riveting story.

After performing a concert at London's Royal Academy of Music,

20-year-old American flautist Edwin Rist boarded a train for an outpost of the British Museum of Natural History. Home to one of the world's largest ornithological collections, the museum was full of rare bird specimens whose gorgeous feathers were worth staggering amounts of money to the men who shared Edwin's obsession: the Victorian art of salmon fly-tying. Once inside, the champion fly-tier grabbed hundreds of bird skins – some collected 150 years earlier by a contemporary of Darwin's, Alfred Russel Wallace – and escaped into the darkness. What would possess a person to steal dead birds? Had Edwin paid the price for his crime? What became of the missing skins? But as absurd as the town's carnival atmosphere has become, nothing is more startling than the realization that Cullen's sensitive, gifted 15-year-old brother Gabriel has suddenly and inexplicably disappeared. Cullen navigates his way through a summer of finding and losing love, holding his fragile family


A WOLF CALLED WANDER BY ROSANNE PARRY



MAKE READING FUN!

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD AVOID THE SUMMER SLIDE?

It's simple – read for fun! Make reading aloud with your child a daily habit and encourage your child to read for fun on their own.

WHAT IS THE SUMMER SLIDE?

The summer slide is a term for the period of summer learning loss that many children experience. Children who don't read during the summer can lose two months of the previous year's academic gains. Their classmates who do read for fun during the summer are prepared for the next school year and ready to learn. By the sixth grade, children who do not regularly read during the previous summers can be 2 academic years behind their peers.

TIPS FOR MAKING READING A FUN TIME!

FIND THEIR OWN BOOKS. Let your child browse the Library shelves for books they are interested in. You will be surprised at what they select! Even if the book is above or below their reading level, let them check it out. Reading above their reading level will push them forward and reading below their reading level will build their literacy confidence.

UNDERSTAND WHAT THEY ARE READING. Ask your child questions about what they are reading. This will help them build comprehension, and it will create stimulating conversation between parent and child. Instead of testing your child on their books, ask open-ended questions like, "What is this story about? Tell me about your favorite character. What's the most exciting thing that has happened in this book?"

NEVER USE READING AS DISCIPLINE. If there's one way to suck the fun out of reading, it's to use it as punishment. Your child should never associate reading with negative emotions like anger or shame.

TAKE THEM TO THE LIBRARY. Sign your child up for their very own Library card!

INCENTIVIZE READING by registering your child for the summer reading challenge. The Library gives out fun prizes for reading. Plus, if they complete the summer reading challenge, they'll be entered to win the grand prize: a bicycle from the Kiwanis of Greater Ouachita.

MODEL READING. Register yourself for the summer reading challenge! Make the summer reading challenge a family affair.



LIONS, TIGERS AND BEARS - OH MY!

Dorothy from the *The Wizard of Oz* would have found lions, tigers and bears, plus a few other live animal mascots in and around Ouachita Parish if she had traveled here instead of Oz. At one time, Ouachita Parish High School had a live lion, Neville High School had a live tiger and Delhi High School had a live bear. Other mascots have included bulldogs, a monkey, a racoon and of course, a cat, the Library's own Gardenia.


The earliest record of an animal mascot in our area is that of Louisiana Tech. The legend of their English Bulldog mascot dates to 1899 when a stray bulldog followed a group of five students home from class. Legend is that a fire broke out during the night and the bulldog saved the students by alerting them, but

that first bulldog did not survive (orgs.latech. edu). There have been a succession of bulldogs at Louisiana Tech since then and Louisiana Tech introduced Tech XXII in 2018 (latech.edu).

In 1926 the Central Fire Station selected a racoon as mascot. The men of the station had tried several cats and even a rattlesnake before adopting "Coon" (*Monroe News Star* August 19, 1926). In 1942, the Monroe Fire Department had a monkey named Pedro for a mascot. Pedro was a gift from James A. Noe (*Monroe Morning World* December 20, 1942).

In 1956, Delhi High School received one of three bears that were raised from cubs and then given to new homes. One bear went to a zoo in Baton Rouge, one to Monroe's Bernstein Park (then home to the zoo) and the third went to the Delhi football team for a mascot. Both the Bernstein bear and the Delhi bear were housed at the zoo with the Delhi bear being available for travel to football games (Jan. 5, 1956 *Monroe News Star*).

In 1963, students at Neville High School raised money to purchase a six-month-old tiger cub. The tiger lived at the Louisiana Purchase Gardens and Zoo and was named Shasta. Shasta attended pep rallies at the school and traveled to football games in a special truck and cage. Shasta rode in a parade in 1966 when Neville played the Ruston Bearcats. Shasta died February 16, 1972 after battling influenza. Afterward, Shasta II was purchased. Information and a picture from the 1980 Neville Yearbook, the Monroyan, shows Shasta III, who was also known as Big Red.



Ouachita Parish High School had a lion mascot named Cheepa. Cheepa was an African lion who was born and raised at the zoo. He attended football games from the time he was a cub through the 1975 football season. Cheepa died June 12, 1976 (June 1976 News Star). Cheepa must have had a successor as a February 8, 1988, News Star World article indicates that both Neville and Ouachita Parish had live mascots that lived at the Louisiana Purchase Gardens and Zoo. The animals were taken from the Zoo to pep rallies and football games. By this time both school systems and Zoo officials were considering the liability involved in having students and adults take big cats away from the zoo even though there had been no problems with the arrangement that been in place for 25 years.

The University of Louisiana Monroe selected the Warhawk as mascot in 2006. Capri, a red shoulder hawk, travels to all home football games and lives at the Louisiana Purchase Gardens and Zoo (4-17-20 myarklamiss.com). Before the Warhawk, different Northeast Louisiana State College students portrayed "Chief Brave Spirit" riding various spotted horses during football games between 1959 and 2006. Grambling State University has claimed the tiger as its mascot since 1901 (gram.edu), but the mascot was not named Eddie the Tiger until 2014 after the great Eddie Robinson (thecelebrationbowl.com).
