JUVENILE LIBRARY CARD UPDATE

All libraries in the State of Louisiana are now required by law to implement options for restricted juvenile library card access. On June 1, 2024, the Ouachita Parish Public Library will begin updating library cards for all minor children aged 0-17. Parents and guardians can update the type of access at their convenience at any library location with a photo ID. All juvenile library cards will expire and need to be updated. In order

to check out materials or use digital resources, an updated form will be necessary. The parent or guardian can complete the application and signature without the child present.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to exercise their rights and responsibilities to decide upon the level of access and materials their children will have.

Juvenile library card unrestricted - allows access to books, audiobooks, magazines, and digital resources within all collections.

Juvenile library card restricted - allows access to books, audiobooks and magazines but prohibits access to all eBooks, eAudiobooks and items identified as restricted under Louisiana Revised Statute 25:225.

DVDs, art prints and special collection items are designated for adult cards only.

The book sale is cash only. All book sale proceeds benefit the Friends of the Library, who support Library programming. The book sale is the last Friday and Saturday of each month except November and December.

ADVENTURES OF YESTERDAY DUNBAR HUNTER EXPEDITION

Since Summer Reading Challenge 2024 is all about Adventure and Adventure Begins at Your Library, this "From the Archives" is about an early Louisiana adventure, the Dunbar and Hunter expedition up the Washita River now knowns as the Ouachita River. In 1803, when Napoleon Bonaparte, Emperor of France, sold the Louisiana Territory to Thomas Jefferson, President of the United States, Jefferson authorized four ventures into the new territory as part of his Corps of Discovery. These expeditions to explore the new territory included the well-known Lewis and Clark expedition into the northern part of the territory led by Meriwether Lewis and William Clark in May 1804, the expedition up the Ouachita River in 1804-1805 led by William Dunbar and George Hunter, the Red River Expedition in 1806 led by Thomas Freeman and Peter Custis, and the Zebulon Pike expedition into the Rocky Mountains and the Southwest in 1806-1807. Since much of the Louisiana Purchase had not been mapped, these expeditions were a

William Dunbar and George Hunter were not the first Europeans to explore the Ouachita River area. Don Juan (Jean-Baptiste) Filhiol had already established Fort Miro and French and Spanish settlers had hunted, traded, and farmed along the Black and Ouachita Rivers. Trade relations with the Native Americans living there had already been established before Dunbar and Hunter traveled into the region.

The expedition into the Ouachita River area began October 16, 1804, about 15 miles south of Natchez, Mississippi. The group traveled the Mississippi River south to the mouth of the Red River. They reached the Black River on October 19. By October 23rd, the party reached the mouth of the Ouachita River where they camped. They traveled on

reaching the Boeuf Prairie and Turkey Creek areas of Franklin Parish on October 31. They reached Fort Miro November 6 and met with Lieutenant Bowmar who had taken possession of the settlement for the United States. Hunter wrote in his journal "About half past 3 pm arrived at the Military post originally called fort Miro named after a Governor of that name at Orleans formerly. The Spanish old stockade fort has been torn down, and a new small one without cannon or port holes erected by the Americans under Leuit. Bowman". Filhiol, who had explored the Ouachita as early as 1782, had seen the area pass from Spain to France and then to America. The expedition stayed in the Fort Miro area until November 15 when they continued up the Ouachita River into southern Arkansas. They reached what is present day Camden on November 22 and then traveled past the Little Missouri River on to Hot Springs, Arkansas with the last nine miles being overland. They explored the area around Hot Springs for a month before heading homeward January 8, 1805. The group stopped at Fort Miro on the return trip and finally arrived back in Natchez, Mississippi on January 27, 1805.

William Dunbar and George Hunter expected to make another larger, longer expedition but politics and personal issues kept that from happening. They provided detailed reports about the Ouachita River area. These reports, a map and letters between Dunbar and President Jefferson provide more information. Thomas Jefferson included accounts of the expedition in his report to Congress and by the time Dunbar died in 1810 he had published twelve papers on the part of the Louisiana Purchase that included what is now Ouachita parish.
